#### What has the Co-operative Trust achieved so far?

- A wider range of sporting opportunities has been provided for your children
- Training for teachers which many schools could not afford on their own.
- This training has enabled the wide array of sports programmes to be put in place for your children.
- There have also been programmes for the children in Arts with 20 children gaining Arts Awards through the Aspire programme.
- Over 100 children have benefited from additional maths classes, boosting their achievements and resulting in more Level 4 6 Maths SATS scores.
- There have been programmes to build self-confidence and resilience in vulnerable children.
- From May to Sept 2014 we saved nearly £6,000 on classroom resources through bulk purchasing.
- By working together we were able to pay for a prestigious national trainer to train every Teaching Assistant and teacher in 'Brain Based Learning.'
- Parc Eglos School was awarded Teaching School status last term. They
  were able to show that they were working in partnership with other local
  schools and together the schools were making a difference to the
  achievements of our pupils.
- This achievement means that there will be even more opportunities for staff and pupils in the Trust in the coming months, meaning your child benefits.
- As schools in the Helston and Lizard Peninsular, we are proud to be working together for our communities. Our work is based on the co-operative values of self-help, self-responsibility, equity, equality, democracy and solidarity.
